**Motion for Action**

**I. SY 2021-2022 Health and Safety Plan**

Section 2001(i)(1) of the American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act requires each local education agency (LEA) that receives funding under the ARP Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief (ESSER) Fund to develop and make publicly available on the LEA's website a Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan, hereinafter referred to as a Health and Safety Plan.

Each LEA must create a Health and Safety Plan that addresses how it will maintain the health and safety of students, educators, and other staff, and which will serve as local guidelines for all instructional and non-instructional school activities during the period of the LEA's ARP ESSER grant. The Health and Safety Plan should be tailored to the unique needs of each LEA and its schools and must take into account public comment related to the development of, and subsequent revisions to, the Health and Safety Plan.

The Health and Safety Plan has been updated to reflect the updated masking guidance from the CDC which was released on February 25, 2022.

**MOTION:** To approve the district's revised Health and Safety Plan for the 2021-2022 school year as described above. Further, effective Monday, April 4, 2022 wearing facial masks will be optional in all school district buildings. In the event Delaware County returns to high COVID-19 Community Levels and/or COVID-19 related cases rise within the district, the Administration has the ability to reinstate "Universal Masking" as a mitigation effort.
